Our Cookie Policy explains what cookies are, how we use cookies, and how to set and change your cookie settings.

What are cookies?

Cookies are small text files that are sent from our server to your browser and stored on your computer, and that your browser provides to our Website each time you return to our Website.

Cookies help us to analyse web traffic and identify which pages of our Website are being used. Our Website also uses cookies to respond to you as an individual so that we can tailor to your needs by gathering and remembering information about your preferences, as well as enabling you to login to your account. We use this information for the purposes set out below.

Does Event-tours use cookies?

Yes. Event-tours and our marketing partners, affiliates, and analytics or service providers use cookies and other technologies to ensure everyone who uses the Websites has the best possible experience.

Our use of cookies

Our cookies fall into the following categories:

- Essential cookies: These cannot be opted-out of. Essential cookies are required for the operation of our website and to meet our contractual obligations with 3rd party suppliers. One example of an operational cookie is "lastSerchDest" which helps us remember what product you selected when you are booking a product with us. Another example of an essential analytics cookie is Google Analytics (excluding remarketing and advertising reporting features) which provides us with anonymous and aggregated website performance data.
- Performance cookies: These cookies are not Essential but help us improve the service we provide to you. One example of a Performance cookie is Powerfront, which allows you to ask us questions on Live Chat if you have any questions while you navigate through our website.
- Marketing cookies. These cookies allow us to make our marketing to you more relevant and to target advertising to you while you are on other sites. Please note that turning off Marketing cookies won't mean that you will never see any of our advertising, it just means that it will not be personalised. Also, accepting Marketing cookies means that you may see advertising from our partners while on our website.
- An example of a Marketing cookie is the Google Analytics cookie (remarketing and advertising reporting features) it records your visit to our websites, the

pages you have visited and actions you have taken. We may use this to make our advertising displayed on other sites, search engines or social media platforms more relevant to you.

Consent and Control

Before Cookies are placed on your computer or device, you will be shown a prompt requesting your consent to set those Cookies. By giving your consent to the placing of Cookies you are enabling us to provide the best possible experience and service to

you. You may, if you wish, deny consent to the placing of Cookies (unless those Cookies are from the Essential category); however certain features of our site may not function fully or as intended. Also, you will be given the opportunity to opt-in or opt-out of different categories of Cookie that we use. Cookie Settings at any time to review or change these preferences.

In addition to the controls that we provide, you can choose to enable or disable Cookies in your internet browser. Most internet browsers also enable you to choose whether you wish to disable all Cookies or only third-party Cookies. By default, most internet browsers accept Cookies but this can be changed.
